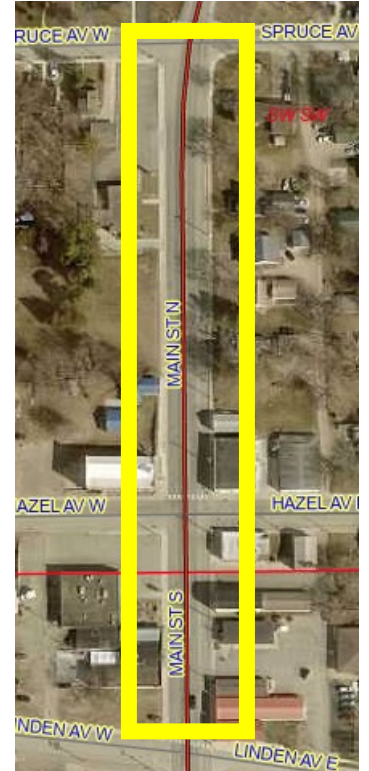


ADOPT A FLOWER POT
