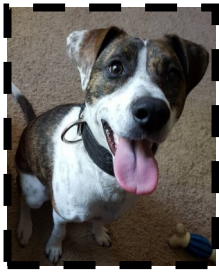

## **DON'T FORGET TO LICENSE YOUR DOG!**



Dog owners living within the City of Kimball Are required to purchase a dog license every year. Failure to license your dog each year may result in a citation, if you own a dog, please follow the instructions below to avoid a citation.

All dogs 6 months of age and older must be licensed annually and shall wear a dog tag. Licenses must be renewed at City Hall by January 1, of each year. Bring or mail the following to the City Hall:

- Proof of current rabies vaccination
- \$10.00 Licensing fee (After Feb. 15th the license fee is \$30)

## **Help first responders find you when every second counts.**

If an emergency occurs at your house will first responders and emergency personnel be able to find you? Is your address displayed on your house or mailbox? Is it visible from the street?

House numbers should be clear enough so that Police and Fire Departments, Paramedics and others can quickly locate properties in an emergency. House numbers and mail box numbers are often the only way that first-responders can identify their intended destinations.

Check your house and mailbox to make sure your numbers are:

- ⇒ 3 inches tall or larger, block numbers - not script.
- ⇒ On a contrasting background.
- ⇒ Unobstructed by trees, shrubs or light fixtures.
- ⇒ VISIBLE FROM THE STREET and with proper lighting.
- ⇒ As close to your front door as possible.
- ⇒ On BOTH sides of your mailbox.

Also remember, your house number may be visible today and not be visible the next day.

1. If there are nearby trees or shrubs; keep them trimmed.
2. Keep them clean; if they are covered in mud, wipe them off.
3. In our snowy winters, make sure your house number is not hidden by a snow bank.



## **Winter Weather Reminders:**

### ***Sidewalk Cleaning***

Please keep in mind that your sidewalks need to be cleared within 24 hours after a snow fall of 2 inches or more or blown in by the wind. It is the property owner's responsibility to clear the abutting sidewalk to their property. If your sidewalk isn't cleared within the allowed amount of time, the city will follow the abatement process; this means the City will clear it for you and send you a bill.

***Snow Removal Policy*** - Snow accumulation must be over 2 inches before the plowing operation begins. Priority streets are plowed first. The sand and salt mixture will be minimized to certain areas. Cleaning adjacent to and in front of mailboxes is the resident's responsibility.

### ***Winter Parking Reminder***

No person shall park a vehicle upon any street in the City between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., on any date that falls between 12:01 a.m. November 1<sup>st</sup> and 11:59 p.m. April 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year. The City of Kimball may, in its sole discretion, tow any vehicle parked in violation of this section to an impound lot. The cost of the tow and impound fee shall be paid by the owner of the vehicle prior to the vehicle being released from impound.

It should be noted the fine amount for a vehicle parked in violation of this section is \$30.

### **KEEP THEM CLEAR**

If there's a fire hydrant near your house, do your part to keep it accessible this winter:



**If you have a fire hydrant near your residence please help keep it free from snow. In case of a fire this could save your house or your neighbors.**



**Starting January 1, 2020 the City will no longer be hanging door hangers for water shut offs. Utility Bills are due the 28th of every month. Payments can be made at the City office during business hours, placed in the drop slot, mailed or pay online (follow the links on the City of Kimball website). The City of Kimball also accepts credit cards in person or over the phone.**
