Winter Weather Reminders:

Sidewalk Cleaning

Please keep in mind that your sidewalks need to be cleared within 48 hours after a snow fall of 2 inches or more or blown in by the wind. It is the property owner's responsibility to clear the abutting sidewalk to their property. If your sidewalk is not cleared within the allowed amount of time, the city will follow the abatement process. This means the City will clear it for you and send you a bill.

Snow Removal Policy - Snow accumulation must be over 2 inches before the plowing operation begins. Priority streets are plowed first. The sand and salt mixture will be minimized to certain areas. Cleaning adjacent to and in front of mailboxes is the resident's responsibility.

Winter Parking Reminder

No person shall park a vehicle upon any street in the City between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., on any date that falls between 12:01 a.m. November 1st and 11:59 p.m. April 30st of the following year. The City of Kimball may, in its sole discretion, tow any vehicle parked in violation of this section to an impound lot. The cost of the tow and impound fee shall be paid by the owner of the vehicle prior to the vehicle being released from impound. It should be noted the fine amount for a vehicle parked in violation of this section is \$30.



Be prepared for winter:

In case you are stranded, keep a kit of emergency supplies in your car including:
Jumper cables - might want to include flares or reflective triangle; **Flashlights** - with extra batteries; **First Aid Kit** - remember any necessary medications, baby formula and diapers if you have a small child; **Food** - non-perishable food such as canned food, and protein rich foods like nuts and energy bars; **Manual can opener**

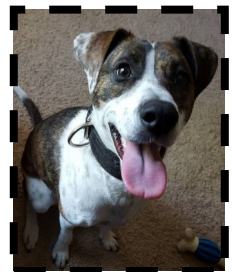
Water - at least 1 gallon of water per person a day for at least 3 days; **Basic toolkit** - pliers, wrench, screwdriver; **Pet supplies** - food and water; **Radio** - battery or hand cranked; **Cat litter or sand** - for better tire traction; **Shovel; Ice scraper; Clothes** - warm clothes, gloves, hat, sturdy boots, jacket and an extra change of clothes for the cold; **Blankets** - or sleeping bags; **Charged Cell Phone** - and car charger

Don't forget to license your dog by January 1st

Dog owners living within the City of Kimball are required to purchase a dog license every year. Failure to license your dog each year may result in a citation. If you own a dog follow the instructions below to avoid a citation.

All dogs 6 months of age and older must be licensed annually and shall wear a dog tag. License must be renewed at City Hall by January 1st of each year. Bring or mail the following to City Hall:

- ◆ Proof of current rabies vaccination
- ◆ \$10.00 Licensing fee (after Feb 15 the license fee is \$30)
