## SERVE WEATHER REMINDERS

### *Sidewalk Cleaning*

Please keep in mind that your sidewalks need to be cleared within 24 hours after a snow fall of 2 inches or more or blown in by the wind. It is the property owner's responsibility to clear the abutting sidewalk to their property. If your sidewalk isn't cleared within the allowed amount of time, the city will follow the abatement process.

### *Snow Removal Policy*

- Snow accumulation must be over 2 inches before the plowing operation begins.
- Priority streets are plowed first.
- The sand and salt mixture will be minimized to certain areas.
- When cleaning snow off of private property, DO NOT push snow onto the

street MN Statute 160.2715.

- Cleaning adjacent to mailboxes is the resident's responsibility. The city will get as close to the curb as possible.
- Mail box front should be placed 6 inches behind curb.

### *Winter Parking Reminder Restrictions—515.01*

No person shall park a vehicle upon any street in the city between the hours of 10:00 pm – 6:00 am, on any date that falls between Nov. 1 (12:01 am) and April 30th (11:59 pm) the following year.

### *Towing Vehicles - 515.02*

The city of Kimball may in its sole discretion, tow any

vehicle parked in violation of this section to an impound lot. The cost of the tow and impound fee shall be paid by the owner of the vehicle prior to the vehicle being released to the owner.

### *Penalty - 515.03*

Any person who violates the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor. It should be noted the fine amount for a vehicle parked in violation of this section is \$30.

### *Adopt a Fire Hydrant*

If you have a fire hydrant near your residence please help keep it free from snow. In case of a fire this could save your house or your neighbors. **THANKS!**

## DOG LICENSING

All dogs 6 months of age and older must be licensed annually and shall wear a dog tag. Licenses must be renewed at City Hall by January 1, of each year. You must bring along the following:

- Proof/certificate of recent rabies vaccination
- \$10.00 Licensing fee (reminder after Feb. 15 the late fee is \$30)

## CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP

The city will be picking up Christmas trees on Friday, January 14th. If you would like your tree picked up make sure it is on the curb by 8:00 am.

## GARBAGE RATES INCREASING

Garbage rates will be increasing to \$12.59 a month beginning with your February statement. This increase was approved at the council meeting on June 1, 2006.
