The City of Kimball will be starting a new phase of our comprehensive plan that will be working to re-vamp our current ordinances

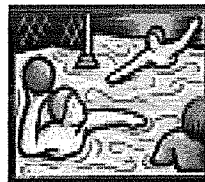

SWIMMING POOL REGULATIONS

If you would like to put up a storable pool in the City of Kimball, you must get a permit from the Zoning Administrator, yearly. The cost is \$10.00 for the permit, and \$35.50 for the fence permit. A permit is required for storable swimming pools capable of holding a water depth of more than 24 inches at any point, with a maximum of 48 inches, and in which the pool walls are entirely above the adjacent grade and the capacity does not exceed 5,000 gallons.

Storable pools will be allowed for use from May 1 thru October 1 each year. Storable pools must be disassembled and stored when not in use.

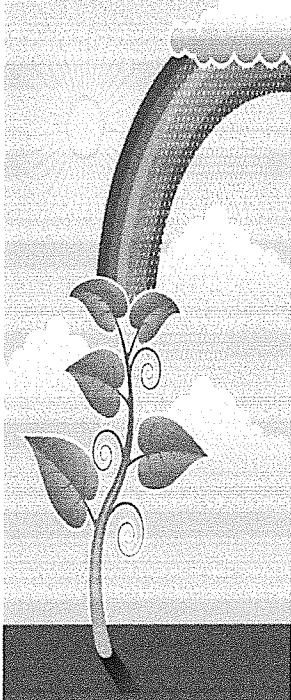
If interested in getting a pool permit, contact the Zoning Administrator, Chris, Monday thru Friday, 8:00a.m. to Noon.

**TO: ALL CITY RESIDENTS-
BRUSH & COMPOST PICKUP**

The Public works Department will be picking up brush and compost every **TUESDAY MORNING BEGINNING AT 6:30A.M. ON APRIL 14, 2009.**

Please follow these **SIMPLE** rules.

- **Brush not to exceed 4 feet in length MUST be bundled and tied.**
- **Compost, not to exceed 50 pounds, should be bagged or placed in containers approved by the Public Works Department**
- **Brush and compost shall be placed near the curb, the night before, to assure pickup.**
- **ONLY CORN-BASED SELF COMPOSTING BAGS WILL BE PICKED UP. THESE BAGS ARE AVAILABLE AT GOH-MANN'S FOODS.**

Pickups will only be made at scheduled times, unless prior approval has been received from the Public Works Department.

Large quantities of Brush and Compost will be picked up at a cost of \$45.00 per load.

If you are going to drop off Brush or Compost yourself, **you need** to contact the Public Works at 980-4904 or 980-4906, for approval.

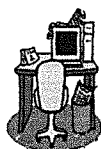
