ADOPT A FLOWER POT

We have had a lot of feedback on bringing back the concrete planters that the city has used in the past. We are opening it up for any of the residents to “Adopt a Flower Pot”.

- First Come First Serve (we have 10)
- The pots will be placed on Main Street between Linden Ave North of the railroad tracks and Spruce Ave North of the bank. (see map)
- Whoever adopts the pot is in charge of the planting and maintaining of the pot.

Golf Carts Reminder

Friendly reminder if you own a street legal golf cart and drive around on the city streets. You are required to register it annually with the city, before you can ride it around. This is a FREE permit, but you need to receive a sticker to place on your windshield from city hall.
