As you are aware, the City has undertaken some changes within the past couple of months. Among them: changing the company we contract with to provide residential garbage and recycling service and changing the processing company used to accept credit/debit card and ACH payments.

The processing company that is now being used to accept credit/debit card and ACH payments also offers e-bills and automatic withdrawal for payments of your City utility bills.

The transition has been somewhat rocky, but thank you for your patience during these changes.

Nuisances

With spring arriving earlier than planned this year, complaints on public nuisances are also occurring earlier. City Ordinance Chapter 4 Public Health and Welfare Section 400 deals with nuisances. Residents and business owners should know these ordinances to avoid public nuisance complaints.

Common nuisance complaints received by the City are: junk in yards including but not limited to household appliances, automobile bodies, trash and debris situated in a manner as to constitute a fire, health or safety hazard; placing and/or throwing glass, nails or other items which may injure any person, animal or vehicle passing over the item; inoperable and/or unlicensed motor vehicles; animal feces that owners do not pick up and any dog that repeatedly and habitually barks, howls, bays or whines.

Residents should also be aware of the fact that during construction or repair of property, building materials should be stacked or stored in a neat and orderly fashion and in a manner so as to avoid presenting any danger to the general public.



Severe Weather Reminders

Please remember all snow and ice needs to be removed from public sidewalks within 24 hours after the precipitation has ceased to fall. It is the property owners responsibility to clear the abutting sidewalk to their property. If your sidewalk is not cleared within the allowed amount of time, the City will follow the abatement process.

Snow Plowing & Ice Control Policy: Snow accumulation must be over 2 inches before the plowing operation begins. Priority streets are plowed first. The sand and salt mixture will be minimized to certain areas. When cleaning snow off of private property,

DO NOT push snow onto the street or on to another property. This is a violation of MN Statute 160.2715. Any one violating this statute will be guilty of a misdemeanor. Cleaning adjacent to mailboxes is the resident's responsibility. The city will get as close to the curb as possible.

Winter Parking Reminder: No person shall park a vehicle upon any street in the City between the hours of 10:00 pm – 6:00 am, on any date that falls between Nov. 1 (12:00 am) and April 30th (11:59 pm) the following year. The City of Kimball may, in its sole discretion, tow any vehicle parked in violation of this section to an impound lot. The cost of the tow and impound fee shall be paid by the owner of the vehicle prior to the vehicle being released from the impound. Any person who violates the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor.



MOVE OVER FOR FLASHING LIGHTS. IT'S THE LAW.

- When traveling on a road with two or more lanes, you must keep over one full lane away from stopped emergency vehicles with flashing lights activated — ambulance, fire, law enforcement, maintenance and construction vehicles.
- Reduce speed if you are unable to safely move over a lane.
- Failing to take these actions endangers personnel who provide critical and life-saving services. Fines can exceed \$100.
