March can still bring Wintery Weather!

Please remember all snow and ice needs to be removed from public sidewalks within 24 hours after the precipitation has ceased to fall. It is the property owners responsibility to clear the abutting sidewalk to their property. If your sidewalk is not cleared within the allowed amount of time, the City will follow the abatement process.

Snow Plowing & Ice Control Policy: Snow accumulation must be over 2 inches before the plowing operation begins. Priority streets are plowed first. The sand and salt mixture will be minimized to certain areas. When cleaning snow off of private property, **DO NOT** push snow onto the street or on to another property. This is a violation of MN Statute 160.2715. Any one violation this statute will be guilty of a misdemeanor. Cleaning adjacent to mailboxes is the resident's responsibility. The city will get as close to the curb as possible.



Winter Parking Reminder: No person shall park a vehicle upon any street in the City between the hours of 10pm & 6am, on any date that falls between Nov. 1 (12:00 am) and April 30th (11:59 pm) the following year. The city of Kimball may, in it's sole discretion, tow any vehicle parked in violation of this section to an impound lot. The cost of the tow and impound fee shall be paid by the owner of the vehicle prior to the vehicle being released from impound. Any person who violates the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor.



Common Distractions are the reason Inattentive Driving accounts for One in Four Crashes in Minnesota

Phones - Phone Conversations pull your focus off the road, whether hands-free or not. Turn ringers off and put phones out of reach to avoid the urge to answer or dial, or have passengers handle calls. It is illegal for drivers with learning permits or provisional license to use a cell phone while driving.



Texting - It is illegal for all drivers to read or compose text/emails, and access the Web on a wireless device while the vehicle is in motion or part of traffic. Violations are up to \$300.

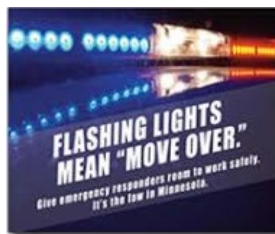
Adjusting Controls - Set music, air and mirrors before driving. Ask a passenger to handle to controls.



Eating & Drinking - Avoid eating and reaching for food or drink.

Reading - GPS device, as well as maps, newspapers and books are all serious distractions. Pull over to study a map, and know trip directions in advance.

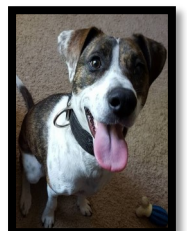

This included scenes where only a police may be present (or tow trucks, construction vehicles, fire trucks, ambulances, ect.) Please take care and drive safely.

License your Dog

All dogs 6 months of age and older must be licensed annually and shall wear a dog tag. Bring or mail the following to City Hall:

- Proof of rabies vaccination.

Special Waste Disposal Options

Waste Management of Minnesota provides convenient waste options for our customers. In Minnesota, there are many regulations to protect the environment and ensure safe, responsible disposal of waste. As a result, the following items cannot be mixed with your regular trash.

- ⇒ Yard Waste: Grass, leaves and brush can be disposed with the City of Kimball's curbside pick up on Tuesday mornings in the spring/summer months. It can also be disposed of at special locations with Waste Management. Please call their Customer Service Representatives for disposal options at 1-888-960-0008.
- ⇒ Sharps Disposal: Waste Management now offers a convenient mail in program to dispose of used sharps. Contact them at (800) 664-1434 for more information.
- ⇒ Fluorescent-Bulb Recycling: Fluorescent lamps contain mercury and cannot be mixed with regular garbage. Contact Waste Management at (800) 664-1434 for more information about convenient mail in program.
