Clean Up Day REMINDER:

Historically, the city has held Clean-up day the 1st Saturday in May. Starting in 2022 due to availability we changed the date to September.

The Clean-up day for 2023 is September 23rd. It will still take place from 8am—11am and be held in the parking lot area just to the East of A.M. Maus & Son.

Compost Site:

The compost site is currently open.

Public works will keep an eye on the site, so please make sure we are respectful and place only acceptable items within the area.

We may have to close again due to inclement weather and road conditions being bad, make sure to watch for signs while entering.

Brush & Compost Pick-Up

Starts May 2nd & Ends October 31st

Tuesday Mornings: All brush/compost must be placed at the curb by 6:30am.

Rules to follow:

- ⇒ Brush not to exceed 4 feet in length & it must be bundled and tied.
- ⇒ Compost not to exceed 50 lbs. **ONLY** corn-based self-composting bags will be picked up. Compostable bags are distinct from regular plastic bags because they are usually clear or green-tinted opaque color. Most home improvement, grocery and hardware stores now carry them. If you don't see them, ask an employee at the store.
- ⇒ **Biodegradable bags and Regular Garbage bags are NOT accepted and will NOT be picked up!**
- ⇒ **COMPOSTABLE BAGS ONLY!**



Prepping your home for Spring Storms

Warmer temperatures, colorful spring flowers, and longer days are just around the corner. Unfortunately, so is the uptick in unpredictable and often severe spring thunderstorms.

- ⇒ **Trim any dead or overhanging branches** from trees near your home to prevent them from falling and causing roof or siding damage during a storm.
- ⇒ **Ensure your roof and gutters are in good condition** and free of debris to prevent water from seeping into your home. Check that all eaves, fascia, and soffits are securely attached and rot-free.
- ⇒ **Check your home's foundation for cracks** or signs of water damage and repair them if necessary.
- ⇒ **Secure all loose items around your home**, like patio furniture and grills, that could be blown away during a severe storm.
- ⇒ **Keep an emergency kit on hand**, including a flashlight, batteries, first aid supplies, and a generator in case of power outages.
- ⇒ **Review your homeowner's insurance policy** to make sure you have adequate coverage for severe weather damage.
