We would like to remind all snow removal operators and property owners that it is unlawful to deposit snow on or next to a public highway or street. Minnesota law prohibits the plowing, blowing, shoveling or otherwise placing of snow onto public roadways. This includes the ditch and right of way area along the roadside.

This would also include pushing the snow from your driveway across the street onto the right-of-way of a vacant lot. The snow from your property needs to remain on your property.

According to state law, violations are considered misdemeanors, but civil penalties also apply if the placement of snow creates a hazard such as a slippery area, frozen rut or bump that contributes to a motor vehicle or pedestrian crash. The civil liability can extend to both the property owner and the person who placed the snow.

Other hazards created by improper placement of snow on or near a public roadway include drainage problems, drifting, sight obstruction and safe accessibility. Special attention should be made to keep crosswalks, intersections, entrances and exits clean and unobstructed.

Also remember per City Ordinance all sidewalks must be cleared of snow and ice within 24 hours after the precipitation has ceased to fall. If your sidewalk is not cleared within 24 hours the City is authorized to start the emergency abatement process.

Severe Weather Reminders:

Sidewalk Cleaning

Please keep in mind that your sidewalks need to be cleared within 24

hours after a snow fall of 2 inches or more or blown in by the wind. It is the property owner's responsibility to clear the abutting sidewalk to their property. If your sidewalk isn't cleared within the allowed amount of time, the city will follow the abatement process; this means the City will clear it for you and send you a bill.

Snow Removal Policy - Snow accumulation must be over 2 inches before the plowing operation begins. Priority streets are plowed first. The sand and salt mixture will be minimized to certain areas. Cleaning adjacent to and in front of mailboxes is the resident's responsibility.

Winter Parking Reminder

No person shall park a vehicle upon any street in the City between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., on any date that falls between 12:01 a.m. November 1st and 11:59 p.m. April 30th of the following year. The City of Kimball may, in its sole discretion, tow any vehicle parked in violation of this section to an impound lot. The cost of the tow and impound fee shall be paid by the owner of the vehicle prior to the vehicle being released from impound.

It should be noted the fine amount for a vehicle parked in violation of this section is \$30.

What can I drop in the box?

All unused and unwanted medications are accepted

Please know that you do not need to remove any identifying labels from the bottles. Privacy is of highest importance and the labels are never viewed.

NOTE: this program is for household use, not commercial. Businesses should contact their waste management vendor for medication disposal information.

Why use the drop box?

The goal of the medication drop box program is to keep unused medications out of our water supply as well as out of the hands of individuals who might abuse them. This program is an effort of law enforcement and environmental agencies nationwide. Locally the program is provided by the Sheriff's Office and Environmental Services department.

This box is conveniently located on the front of the building of the Kimball Police Dept. at 40 Hazel Ave E.
