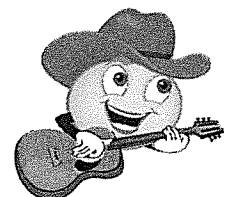

WINTER PARKING NOTICE

THE KIMBALL POLICE DEPARTMENT
IS REMINDING ALL RESIDENTS IN THE
CITY OF KIMBALL, THE WINTER PARK-
ING ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE 515.01 RESTRICTIONS

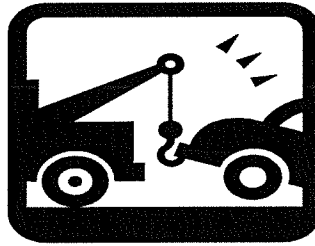
No person shall park a vehicle upon any street
in the city between the hours of 10:00p.m. to
6:00a.m., on any date that falls between
12:01a.m. November 1st and 11:59 p.m. April
30th of the following year.

515.02 TOWING VEHICLES

The City of Kimball may, in its sole
discretion, tow any vehicle parked in violation
of this section to an impound lot. The cost of
the tow and impound fee shall be paid by the
owner of the vehicle prior to the vehicle being
released from impound.

515.03 PENALTY

Any person who violates
the provisions of this section
shall be guilty of a petty misde-
meanor. It should noted the fine
amount for a vehicle parked in
violation of this Section is
\$30.00.

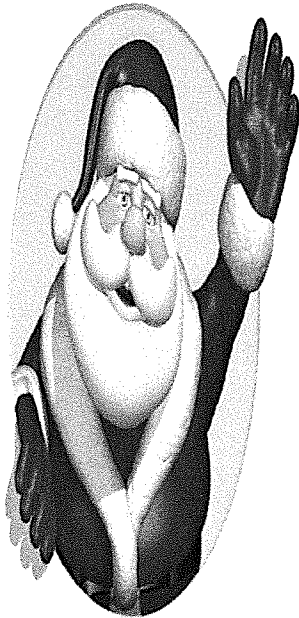

**TO: ALL CITY RESIDENTS-
BRUSH & COMPOST PICKUP**

The Public works Department will be picking up brush and compost every **TUESDAY MORNING AT 6:30A.M. UNTIL OCTOBER 27, 2009.**

Please follow these **SIMPLE** rules.

- **Brush not to exceed 4 feet in length MUST be bundled and tied.**
- **Compost, not to exceed 50 pounds, should be bagged or placed in containers approved by the Public Works Department**
- **Brush and compost shall be placed near the curb, the night before, to assure pickup.**
- **ONLY CORN-BASED SELF COMPOSTING BAGS WILL BE PICKED UP. THESE BAGS ARE AVAILABLE AT GOH-MANN'S FOODS.**

Pickups will only be made at scheduled times, unless prior approval has been received from the Public Works Department.

Large quantities of Brush and Compost will be picked up at a cost of **\$45.00 per load.**

If you are going to drop off Brush or Compost yourself, **you need to contact the Public Works at 980-4904 or 980-4906, for approval.**

**WINTER SIDEWALK
CLEANING PLOICY**

Please keep in mind that your sidewalks need to be cleared within 24 hours after a snow-storm of 2 inches or more or snow blown in by the wind. It is the property owners responsibility to clear the abutting sidewalk to their property. If your sidewalk isn't cleared within the allowed amount of time, you will be sent an abatement form.

SNOW REMOVAL POLICY IN KIMBALL

With winter just around the corner, comes the issue of snow removal. Snow Plowing and Ice Control Policy for the City of Kimball. Some of the major points are:

- Snow accumulation must be over 2 inches before the plowing operation starts.
- Priority Streets are plowed first
- The sand and salt mixture will be minimized to certain areas
- When cleaning snow off of private property, **DO NOT** push snow back onto the street. MN Statute 160.2715
- Cleaning adjacent to mailboxes is the residents' responsibility. The City will get as close to the curbline as possible.
- Mail box front should be placed 6 inches behind curbline.

CITY OFFICE CLOSED

The City Offices will be closed on November 11, November 26, December 25, 2009 and January 1, 2010 in observance of Veterans, Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years.



DOG LICENSE'S DUE

JANUARY 1, 2010

All dogs (even those kept in-doors) over the age of six (6) months must be licensed annually. License's must be renewed by January 1, 2010 at Kimball City Hall, 1 Main St North. The cost of the license is **\$10.00 per dog**. After February 15, 2010 the fee will be **\$30.00**.

You can do the renewal by mail by sending the licensing fee, proof of rabies vaccination and completed dog license application form (see below) to the City of Kimball, P O Box 238, Kimball MN 55353. Your license, dog tag and proof of rabies sheet will be mailed to you or you may come to the office to pick up your license. You may pick up a copy of the ordinance at the City office.

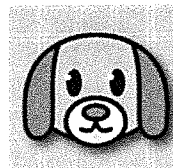
