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ORDINANCE 915 WORK ON CITY PROPERTY

Section 915.01: NO UNAUTHORIZED WORK. No person shall perform any work, service, or labor whether as a volunteer, independent contractor, community service worker or employee, upon any property owned or occupied by the City of Kimball, except as provided herein.

Section 915.02: AUTHORIZED WORK. Employees of the City of Kimball or independent contractors hired by the City of Kimball, duly appointed by the City Council, shall perform such duties as may from time to time be assigned to them by the City Council, during their normal work hours. Employees of the City of Kimball or independent contractors hired by the City of Kimball shall not perform any work, services or other labor on property owned or occupied by the City of Kimball when said employees or independent contractors are not on duty for the City of Kimball, except as otherwise provided herein.

Section 915.03: AUTHORITY TO WORK. Any person wishing to perform any work, services or labor on property owned or occupied by the City of Kimball, except employees of the City of Kimball and independent contractors hired by the City of Kimball doing duties assigned to them while on duty for the City, shall request permission from the City Council before commencing any work, services or labor upon property owned or occupied by the City. The person shall request permission from the City Council as far in advance of the actual date of commencement of work as is practicable. The person shall notify the City Council of the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of all persons intended to be responsible for the work, labor or services to be performed upon property owned or occupied by the City of Kimball.

Section 915.04: CONDITIONS OF WORK. The City Council may establish such conditions to be met by the persons intending to do the work, provide the services or perform the labor on property owned or occupied by the City of Kimball as may be reasonable, just and appropriate. These conditions may include specifically, but not exclusively, the signing of waiver and release forms by every person intending to perform work, services or labor; the filing with the City Council of proof of insurance providing protection for personal injury and liability in an amount to be determined by the Council; limiting the number of persons who will perform the work, labor or services; limiting the activities, tools, or equipment which may be used in providing the work, services or labor; requiring that a City employee be present to supervise the providers of the work, services or labor; or other reasonable conditions which, in the Council's opinion, are reasonable, necessary, just and appropriate.

Section 915.05: TERMINATION OF UNAUTHORIZED WORK. Any person performing work, services or labor upon property owned or occupied by the City who has not first received permission from the City Council, or who is in violation of any of the conditions established by the City Council, may be summarily ejected from the property upon which the

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work, labor or service is being provided, by the City Council, the Mayor, the Chief of Police, or the Maintenance Supervisor.

Section 915.06: RIGHT-OF-THE-WAY DIGGING.

Sec. 01. Election to Manage the Public Right-of-Way.

In accordance with the authority granted to the city under state and federal statutory, administrative and common law, the City hereby elects pursuant to this chapter to manage rights-of-way within its jurisdiction.

Sec. 02. Definitions.

The definitions included in Minnesota Statute Section 237.162, Minnesota Rules 7819.0100 subps. 1 through 25, and Minnesota Rules 7560.0100 subps. 1 through 12 (as from time to time amended or modified) are hereby adopted by reference and are incorporated into this chapter as if set out in full.

Sec. 03. Permit Requirement.

Subd. 1. Permit Required. Except as otherwise provided in this code, no person may obstruct or excavate any right-of-way without first having obtained the appropriate permit from the City.

(a) Excavation Permit. An excavation permit is required to excavate that part of the right-of-way described in such permit and to hinder free and open passage over the specified portion of the right-of-way by placing facilities described therein, to the extent and for the duration specified therein,

(b) Obstruction Permit. An obstruction permit is required to hinder free and open passage over the specified portion of right-of-way by placing equipment described therein on the right-of-way, to the extent and for the duration specified therein. An obstruction permit is not required if a person already possesses a valid excavation permit for the same project.

Subd. 2. Permit Extensions. No person may excavate or obstruct the right-of-way beyond the date or dates specified in the permit unless such person (i) makes a supplementary application for another right-of-way permit before the expiration of the initial permit, and (ii) a new permit or permit extension is granted.

Subd. 3. Delay Penalty. In accordance with Minnesota Rule 7819.1000 subp. 3, and notwithstanding subd. 2 of this section, the City shall establish and impose a delay penalty for unreasonable delays in right-of-way excavation, obstruction, patching, or restoration. The delay penalty shall be established from time to time by City Council resolution.

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Subd. 4. Permit Display. Permits issued under this chapter shall be conspicuously displayed or otherwise available at all times at the indicated work site and shall be available for inspection by the City.

Sec. 04. Permit Application.

Application for a permit shall contain, and will be considered complete only upon compliance with the requirements of the following provisions:

- (a) Submission of a completed permit application form, including all required attachments, scaled drawings showing the location and area of the proposed project and the location of all known existing and proposed facilities, and the following information:
 - (1) Each permittee's name, Gopher One-Call registration certificate number, address and e-mail address, if applicable, and telephone and facsimile numbers.
 - (2) The name, address and e-mail address, if applicable, and telephone and facsimile numbers of a local representative. The local representative or designee shall be available at all times. Current information regarding how to contact the local representative in an emergency shall be provided at the time of registration.
 - (3) A certificate of insurance or self-insurance:
 - (i) Verifying that an insurance policy has been issued to the permittee by an insurance company licensed to do business in the State of Minnesota, or a form of self insurance acceptable to the City;
 - (ii) Verifying that the permittee is insured against claims for personal injury, including death, as well as claims for property damage arising out of the (a) use and occupancy of the right-of-way by the permittee, its officers, agents, employees and permittees, and (b) placement and use of facilities and equipment in the right-of-way by the permittee, its officers, agents, employees and permittees, including, but not limited to, protection against liability arising from completed operations, damage of underground facilities and collapse of property;
 - (iii) Naming the City as an additional insured as to whom the coverages required herein are in force and applicable and for whom defense will be provided as to all such coverages;
 - (iv) Requiring that the City be notified 30 days in advance of cancellation of the policy or material modification of a coverage term;
 - (v) Indicating comprehensive liability coverage, automobile liability coverage, workers compensation and umbrella coverage established by the

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City in amounts sufficient to protect the City and the public and to carry out the purposes and policies of this chapter;

(vi) The City may require a copy of the actual insurance policies;

(vii) If the person is a corporation, a copy of the certificate required to be filed under Minn. Stat. Section 302A as recorded and certified to by the Secretary of State.

(viii) A copy of the person's order granting a certificate of authority from the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission or other applicable state or federal agency, where the person is lawfully required to have such certificate from said commission or other state or federal agency.

(b) Payment of money due the City for:

(1) permit fees, estimated restoration costs and other management costs;

(2) prior obstructions or excavations;

(3) any undisputed loss, damage, or expense suffered by the City because of applicant's prior excavations or obstructions of the rights-of-way or any emergency actions taken by the City; and

(4) franchise fees or other charges, if applicable.

Sec. 05. Issuance of permit; conditions.

Subd. 1. Permit Issuance. If the applicant has satisfied the requirements of this chapter, the City shall issue a permit.

Subd. 2. Conditions. The City may impose reasonable conditions upon the issuance of the permit and the performance of the applicant thereunder to protect the health, safety and welfare or when necessary to protect the right-of-way and its current use. In addition, a permittee shall comply with all requirements of local, state and federal laws, including but not limited to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 216D (Gopher One Call Excavation Notice System) and Minnesota Rules Chapter 7560.

Subd. 3. Trenchless Excavation. As a condition of all applicable permits, permittees employing trenchless excavation methods, including but not limited to Horizontal Directional Drilling, shall follow all requirements set forth in Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 216D and Minnesota Rules Chapter 7560, and shall require potholing or open cutting over existing underground utilities before excavating, as determined by the City.

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Sec. 06. Permit Fees.

Subd. 1. Amount. The City shall establish an Excavation permit fee in an amount sufficient to recover the following costs:

- (a) the city management costs;
- (b) degradation costs, if applicable.

Subd. 2. Obstruction Permit Fee. The City shall establish the obstruction permit fee in an amount sufficient to recover the city management costs.

Subd. 3. Payment of Permit Fees. No excavation permit or obstruction permit shall be issued without payment of excavation or obstruction permit fees. The City may allow applicant to pay such fees within 30 days of billing.

Subd. 4. Non Refundable. Permit fees that were paid for a permit that the City has revoked for a breach as stated in Section 1.21 are not refundable.

Subd. 5 Application to Franchises. Unless otherwise agreed to in a franchise, management costs may be charged separately from and in addition to the franchise fees imposed on a right-of-way user in the franchise.

Subd. 6. Consistency of Permit Fees. All permit fees shall be established consistent with the provisions of Minnesota Rule 7819.1000.

Sec. 07. Right-of-Way Patching and Restoration.

Subd. 1. Timing. The work to be done under the excavation permit, and the patching and restoration of the right-of-way as required herein, must be completed within the dates specified in the permit, increased by as many days as work could not be done because of circumstances beyond the control of the permittee or when work was prohibited as unseasonable or unreasonable under Section 1.15.

Subd. 2. Patch and Restoration. Permittee shall patch its own work. The City may choose either to have the permittee restore the right-of-way or to restore the right-of-way itself

(a) City Restoration. If the City restores the right-of-way, permittee shall pay the costs thereof within 30 days of billing. If following such restoration, the pavement settles due to permittee's improper backfilling, the permittee shall pay to the City, within 30 days of billing, all costs associated with having to correct the defective work.

(b) Permittee Restoration. If the permittee restores the right-of-way itself, it

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shall at the time of application for an excavation permit post a construction performance bond in accordance with the provisions of Minnesota Rules 7819.3000.

(c) Degradation Fee in Lieu Restoration. In lieu of right-of-way restoration, a right-of-way user may elect to pay a degradation fee. However, the right-of-way user shall remain responsible for patching and the degradation fee shall not include the costs to accomplish these responsibilities.

Subd. 3. Standards. The permittee shall perform patching and restoration according to the standards and with the materials specified by the City and shall comply with Minnesota Rule 7819.1100.

Subd. 4. Duty to Correct Defects. The permittee shall correct defects in patching, or restoration performed by permittee or its agents. Permittee, upon notification from the City, shall correct all restoration work to the extent necessary, using the method required by the City. Said work shall be completed within 5 calendar days of the receipt of the notice from the City, not including days during which work cannot be done because of circumstances constituting force majeure or days when work is prohibited as unseasonable or unreasonable under Section 1.15.

Subd. 5. Failure to Restore. If the permittee fails to restore the right-of-way in the manner and to the condition required by the City, or fails to satisfactorily and timely complete all restoration required by the City, the City, at its option, may do such work. In that event, the permittee shall pay to the City, within 30 days of billing, the costs of restoring the right-of-way. If permittee fails to pay as required, the City may exercise its rights under the construction performance bond,

Sec. 55.08. Supplementary Applications.

Subd. 1. Limitation on Area. A right-of-way permit is valid only for the area of the right-of-way specified in the permit. No permittee may do any work outside the area specified in the permit, except as provided herein. Any permittee which determines that an area greater than that specified in the permit must be obstructed or excavated must before working in that greater area (i) make application for a permit extension and pay any additional fees required thereby, and (ii) be granted a new permit or permit extension.

Subd. 2. Limitation on Dates. A right-of-way permit is valid only for the dates specified in the permit. No permittee may begin its work before the permit start date or, except as provided herein, continue working after the end date. If a permittee does not finish the work by the permit end date, it must apply for a new permit for the additional time it needs, and receive a new permit or an extension of the old permit before working after the end date of the previous permit. This supplementary application must be submitted before the permit end date.

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Sec. 55.09. Denial of Permit.

The City may deny a permit for failure to meet the requirements and conditions of this chapter or if the City determines that the denial is necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare or when necessary to protect the right-of-way and its current use.

Sec. 10. Installation Requirements.

The excavation, backfilling, patching and restoration, and all other work performed in the right-of-way shall be done in conformance with Minnesota Rules 7819.1100 and other applicable local requirements insofar as they are not inconsistent with the Minnesota Statutes Sections 237.162 and 237.163.

Sec. 11. Inspection.

Subd. 1. Notice of Completion. When the work under any permit hereunder is completed, the permittee shall furnish a completion certificate in accordance with Minnesota Rules 7819.1300.

Subd. 2. Site Inspection. Permittee shall make the work-site available to city personnel and to all others as authorized by law for inspection at all reasonable times during the execution of and upon completion of the work.

Subd 3. Authority of City.

(a) At the time of inspection, the City may order the immediate cessation of any work, which poses a serious threat to the life, health, safety, or well being of the public.

(b) The City may issue an order to the permittee for any work that does not conform to the terms of the permit or other applicable standards, conditions, or codes. The order shall state that failure to correct the violation will be cause for revocation of the permit. Within 10 days after issuance of the order, the permittee shall present proof to the City that the violation has been corrected. If such proof has not been presented within the required time, the City may revoke the permit pursuant to Sec. 1.21.

Sec. 12. Work Done Without a Permit.

Subd. 1. Emergency Situation. Each person with facilities in the right-of-way shall immediately notify the City of any event regarding its facilities that it considers an emergency. The owner of the facilities may proceed to take whatever actions are necessary to respond to the emergency. Within two business days after the occurrence of the emergency, the owner shall apply for the necessary permits, pay the fees associated therewith and fulfill the rest of the requirements necessary to bring itself into compliance with this chapter for the actions it took in response to the emergency.

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If the City becomes aware of an emergency regarding facilities, the City will attempt to contact the local representative of each facility owner affected, or potentially affected, by the emergency. In any event, the City may take whatever action it deems necessary to respond to the emergency, the cost of which shall be borne by the person whose facilities occasioned the emergency.

Subd. 2. Non-Emergency Situation. Except in an emergency, any person who, without first having obtained the necessary permit, obstructs or excavates a right-of-way must subsequently obtain a permit, and as a penalty pay double the normal fee for said permit, pay double all the other fees required by this code, deposit with the City the fees necessary to correct any damage to the right-of-way and comply with all of the requirements of this chapter.

Sec. 13. Supplementary Notification.

If the obstruction or excavation of the right-of-way begins later or ends sooner than the date given on the permit, permittee shall notify the City of the accurate information as soon as this information is known.

Sec. 14. Revocation of Permits.

Subd. 1. Substantial Breach. The City reserves its right, as provided herein, to revoke any right-of-way permit, without a fee refund, if there is a substantial breach of the terms and conditions of any statute, ordinance, rule or regulation, or any material condition of the permit. A substantial breach by permittee shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

- (a) The violation of any material provision of the right-of-way permit;
- (b) An evasion or attempt to evade any material provisions of the right-of-way permit, or the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate any fraud or deceit upon the City or its citizens;
- (c) Any material misrepresentation of fact in the application for a right-of-way permit;
- (d) The failure to complete the work in a timely manner unless a permit extension is obtained or unless the failure to complete work is due to reasons beyond the permittees control; or
- (e) The failure to correct, in a timely manner, work that does not conform to a condition indicated on an issue pursuant to Sec. 1.18.

Subd. 2. Written Notice of Breach. If the City determines that the permittee has committed a substantial breach of a term or condition of any statute, ordinance, rule,

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regulation or any condition of the permit, the City shall make a written demand upon the permittee to remedy such violation. The demand shall state that continued violations might be cause for revocation of the permit. A substantial breach, as stated above, will allow the City, at its discretion, to place additional or revised conditions on the permit to mitigate and remedy the breach.

Subd. 3. Response to Notice of Breach. Within 24 hours of receiving notification of the breach, permittee shall provide the City with a plan, acceptable to the City, which will cure the breach. Permittee's failure to so contact the City, or the permittee's failure to submit an acceptable plan, or permittee's failure to reasonably implement the approved plan, shall be cause for immediate revocation of the permit.

Subd. 4. Reimbursement of City Costs. If a permit is revoked, the permittee shall also reimburse the City for the City's reasonable costs, including restoration costs and the costs of collection and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in connection with such revocation.

Sec. 55.15. Mapping Data.

Subd. 1. Information Required. Each permittee shall provide mapping information required by the City in accordance with Minnesota Rules 7819.4000 and 7819.4100.

Subd. 2. Service Laterals. All permits issued for the installation or repair of service laterals, other than minor repairs as defined in Minnesota Rules 7560.0150 subpart 2, shall require permittee's use of appropriate means of establishing the horizontal locations of installed service laterals, and the service lateral vertical locations in those cases where the City reasonably requires it. Permittees or their subcontractors shall submit to the City evidence of the installed service lateral locations. Compliance with this subdivision 2 and with applicable Gopher State One law and Minnesota Rules governing service laterals installed after December 31, 2005, shall be a condition of any City approval necessary for 1) payments to contractors working on a public improvement project, including those under Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 429; and 2) City approval of performance under development agreements, or other subdivision or site plan approval under Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 462. The City shall reasonably determine the appropriate method of providing such information. Failure to provide prompt and accurate information on the service laterals installed may result in the revocation of the permit issued for the work or for future permits to the offending permittee or its subcontractors.

Sec. 16. Location of Facilities.

Subd. 1. Placement, location, and relocation of facilities must comply with the act, with other applicable law, and with Minnesota Rules 7819.3100, 7819.5000 and 7819.5100, to the extent the rules do not limit authority otherwise available to cities.

Subd. 2. Corridors. The City may assign specific corridors within the right-of-way or any particular segment thereof as may be necessary, for each type of facilities that is or,

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pursuant to current technology, the City expects will someday be located within the right-of-way. All excavation, obstruction, or other permits issued by the City involving the installation or replacement of facilities shall designate the proper corridor for the facilities at issue.

Subd. 3. Limitation of Space. To protect health, safety, and welfare or when necessary to protect the right-of-way and its current use, the City shall have the power to prohibit, or City shall strive to the extent possible to accommodate all existing and potential users of the right-of-way, but shall be guided primarily by considerations of the public interest, the public's needs for the particular utility service, the condition of the right-of-way, the time of year with respect to essential utilities, the protection of existing facilities in the right-of-way, and future City plans for public improvement and development projects which have been determined to be in the public interest.

Subd. 4. Undergrounding. Unless otherwise agreed in a franchise between the applicable right-of-way user and the City, facilities in the right-of-way must be located or relocated and maintained underground in accordance with Section 56 of the City Code.

Sec. 17. Damage to Other Facilities.

When the City does work in the right-of-way and finds it necessary to maintain, support or move facilities to protect it, the City shall notify the local representative as early as is reasonably possible and placed as required. The costs associated therewith will be billed to that facility owner and must be paid within 30 days from the date of billing. Each facility owner shall be responsible for the costs of repairing any facilities in the right-of-way which it or its facilities damage. Each facility owner shall be responsible for the cost of repairing any damage to the facilities of another cause during the City's response to an emergency occasioned by that owner's facilities.

Sec. 18. Right-of-Way Vacation.

Reservation of Right. If the City vacates a right-of-way that contains facilities, the facility owner's rights in the vacated right-of-way are governed by Minnesota Rules 7819.3200.

Sec. 19. Indemnification and Liability.

By applying for and accepting a permit under this chapter, a permittee agrees to defend and indemnify the City in accordance with the provisions of Minnesota Rule 7819.1250.

Sec. 20. Abandoned Facilities.

Removal of Abandoned Facilities. Any person who has abandoned facilities in any right-of-way, shall remove them from the right-of-way if required in conjunction with other right-of-way repair, excavation, or construction, unless the City waives this requirement.

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Sec. 21. Appeal.

A right-of-way user that: (1) has been denied registration; (2) has been denied a permit; (3) has had a permit revoked; (4) believes that the fees imposed are invalid; or (5) disputes a determination of the City regarding Section 1.23 subd. 2 of this ordinance, may have the denial, revocation, fee imposition, or decision reviewed, upon written request, by the City Council. The City Council shall act on a timely written request at its next regularly scheduled meeting. A decision by the City Council affirming the denial, revocation, or fee imposition will be in writing and supported by written findings establishing the reasonableness of the decision.

Sec. 22. Reservation of Regulatory and Police Powers.

A permittee's rights are subject to the regulatory and police powers of the City to adopt and enforce general ordinances necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public.
